## **Tips**

- \*Get the audience's attention and provide a quick introduction
- \*Use a hook
  - =Question / Anecdote / Quote / Statistic / Imagery
- \*Tell a story
  - =Have a Beginning \* Middle \* End / Entry Point \* Journey \* Resolution
  - =Use one or two anecdotes to drive the story
    - =Be sincere and show personal connection
  - =Use humor
    - =Be positive and appropriate
    - =Do not use gimmicks
  - =Use imagery Provide specific visual and sensory details
- \*Practice the 4 Ps Poise, Posture, Pace, Projection
  - =Be up, be energetic, be steady, be clear
  - =Start from memory but focus on delivery (it is okay to use notes as you go)
- \*End big
  - =Package the message in a memorable way
  - =Give thanks and compliments
  - =Spread the love and best wishes
- \*Raise a glass / Get a cheers / Have a hug or handshake

- \*What are your hobbies / interests?
- \*What are your academics / arts / athletics / activities?
- \*What do you care about? What are passionate about?
- \*Where are your from (city/family)? Where are you going (goals / dreams)?
